Carole Sheftic presented A Burned Eagle on a Gourd

Members received instructions and pattern for the project. They were instructed to copy their pattern onto the press n seal then place it on their gourd. Carole showed members the different types of pens that could be used to then wood burn the pattern on their gourd. Once their pattern was burned onto their gourd, Carole demonstrated using the pen to darken tips of the feathers and deepen around the medallion area in order to place their beads. Members were then shown how to fill in the beak and eye with colored pencils. Since, several members were having problems with the white pencil not adhering to the feather and head area, Carole showed them how to dry brush the area using acrylic paint. She said they could add more detail to feathers by burning additional lines in various areas.

Everyone went home with a beautiful Eagle on their Gourd.
